Time

Winter time is here. We put the clocks back. We are adjusting our schedules to the dark evenings and the colder weather. What difference will it make to our lives? Will you read a book on the long evenings or sit by the fire listening to music or radio or look at television? How often have we been advised to use your time well? Time is a precious commodity and a fascinating part of our lives. Recently I was reading with delight about Fr. Timothy Radcliffe OP, the Dominican writer and theologian who is soon to become a Cardinal. I am struck by the fact that he tries to spend 3 hours in prayer every day. This is the wellspring or source of his great wisdom and wonderful spirit of freedom. Sometimes I wake up at 4.00am and I think of the Cistercians who begin their prayer at that hour. How marvellous that these men and women are praying for the world while we sleep. Pope John XX111 got great solace from their prayer for the Church.

You will remember phrases like "Time is up" – at the end of an exam; or "Time, ladies and gentlemen, please!" – closing time in a pub; or "What time is it?" – a question frequently asked before our digital age.

May we enjoy the time in Winter to come to know the Lord better, to content ourselves to sit in and recreate, to use our time well.

I remember in Nigeria seeing people walking calmly, slowly along the roads who gave the impression that they had all the time in the world. Isn't there great wisdom in taking your time to meet together, time to be silent, time to laugh, time to sleep. Let's give thanks for the NOW – this precious time; and may we come refreshed and renewed into the Springtime again.
