On one of our school tours with CBS we visited the cemeteries in Belgium. One of the inscriptions read "Known only to God." And nearby tombstones read – aged 17 years – .I knelt to pray for those brave people who lost their lives in the cause of freedom. In Flanders Fields is a magnificent poem by John McCrae...

In Flanders Fields

In Flanders fields the poppies blow Between the crosses, row on row, That mark our place, and in the sky The larks, still bravely singing, fly Scarce heard amid the guns below.

We are the Dead. Short days ago we lived, felt dawn, saw sunset glow, Loved, and were loved, and now we lie

In Flanders Fields.

Take up our quarrel with the foe: To you, from failing hands we throw
The torch, be yours to hold it high.
If ye break faith with us who die,
We shall not sleep, though poppies grow
In Flanders Fields.
