If you have noticed the pastor has been suffering a nasty chest infection which is seemingly doing the rounds. Unfortunately I was unable to join my colleagues for the Diocesan priests' retreat in Ballyvaloo, Wexford. Instead I have been grounded!

We are delighted to offer our Congratulations to the Prior and Dominican Community who are celebrating the 800th anniversary of the founding of the Black Abbey. Canon Carrigan writes in his History of the Diocese of Ossory: "St. Dominic was called to his eternal reward, at the age of 51, on the 6th August 1221.At the termination of the General Chapter of his Order, held in Bologna, in the early part of the same year, he sent, with the consent of the Supreme Pontiff, his children into Scotland, Ireland, Scandinavia and Greenland, to preach the Gospel, to bring infidels to the Catholic Faith through the Sacrament of Baptism, and to lead sinners to Christ by Penance: all which things they effected to the great benefit of the souls committed to their care."

After the convents of Dublin and Drogheda the next Dominican House in this country was the Monasthirr dhu, Abbatia Nigra, or Black Abbey, Kilkenny, founded in honour of the One and Undivided Trinity, by William Marshall, the younger, Earl of Pembroke, in 1225. Let us give thanks for all the faithful Dominicans who have served our people down through turbulent and painful times in this beautiful church. Let us rejoice and be glad. – **Fr. Jim**
